The mission of New Mornings Reentry Services is to break the cycle of incarceration in our community through the transforming love of Jesus Christ. We provide information, practical services and mentoring to incarcerated and previously incarcerated people who may feel there is no hope. We also seek to connect the area Body of Christ to better meet these individuals' needs and to edify our community as a whole.

### *prison bible study*

Many people within prison walls come from abusive, addictive or dysfunctional family backgrounds. Others have experienced traumatic, life-altering events or simply made poor choices. Many have learned to suppress their pain with substance abuse or some other distraction, like relationships, food, materialism, etc. Prison takes away the constant "noise" of the world, allowing them to see the consequences of their choices and reflect on what and WHO really matters.

New Mornings ministers in the Chester County Correctional Center. A team of staff and volunteers from area churches leads a weekly **WOMEN'S DISCOVERY GROUP**, which focuses on God's Word in a small group environment. We foster caring relationships with those who attend and seek to continue those relationships when they return home—where they must learn to balance the noise of the world with their new found clarity in life.

### *standing in the gap*

Our **CASEWORKER** serves as an advocate and liaison for those in Chester County Prison who plan to return to the Coatesville community. As needed, the caseworker networks with and refers to other service agencies who may best serve the holistic needs of each participant. The caseworker remains full-time to New Mornings participants from our office in Coatesville.

Through the generosity of local churches, we offer **GRACE BAGS** to participants when they are released from prison. These reusable bags include toiletry items, spiritual encouragement and a few luxury items to remind them of God's love and provision while getting back on their feet.

**Work 1st** is an opportunity to help those with a barrier to employment to find hands on assistance. It is offered in partnership with the Chester County Workforce Development Board and Educational Data Systems Incorporated.

### *education*

**FRESH START** is an eight lesson course offered weekly by New Mornings at the Chester County Correctional Center. Through practical guidance, prayer and foundational faith-based principles, this course teaches those who are incarcerated to think differently, and prepares them to make positive choices when they return to their families and communities.

### *encouragement in writing*

Scripture-based **CARDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT** are sent weekly to those involved in our Fresh Start Course, our Women's Discovery Group and to others who have requested mail, regardless of where they are incarcerated. For some, this is the only mail they receive.

### *tutoring program*

**WINGS** is our basic education and tutoring ministry, born out of the educational needs we see in prison. Wings uses computer software, videos, and a Christian curriculum to teach literacy and prepare students to take their GED. This simple, one-on-one program takes place in our Coatesville office and allows students to move at their own pace, while fostering a discipling relationship. We also offer a **GED Academy Class** for those ready to learn in a group setting at a quicker pace.

### *mentor manual*

Previously incarcerated people face many barriers when they return to the community. Having a mentor to serve as a friend, accountability partner, guide and cheerleader can be key to a successful reentry. Our **MENTOR TRAINING MANUAL** is available to help prepare potential mentors. It reinforces principles introduced in *Fresh Start* and could serve as relevant curriculum in any mentoring initiative.
