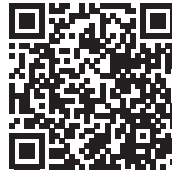
## get involved!

**Transforming Lives, Restoring Communities, Sharing Hope.** The **MISSION** of New Mornings is to restore our community and criminal justice system through faith, connections, and support. In addition to ministries within Chester County Prison, we also partner with and connect clients to other community ministries, nonprofits, and local churches. We envision our community transformed by those who were once forgotten and marginalized, as their lives are transformed by the love and hope of Jesus and the support of His people!

### *prison bible study*

Trauma, abuse, addiction, grief, poor choices... There are many reasons why individuals find themselves in prison, but all have one thing in common: They are in pain and need to know they are **SEEN** and not forgotten. We see prison as a unique **OPPORTUNITY**. It takes away the constant noise of the world, allowing its residents to see the consequences of their poor choices and reflect on what and **WHO** really matters.

New Mornings is privileged to minister inside Chester County Correctional Center. We have a team of staff and volunteers who lead our weekly **WOMEN'S DISCOVERY GROUP** on Tuesday nights, which focuses on God's Word in a small group environment. We also lead **WOMEN'S CHAPEL** on the third Monday of every month in the main prison. We foster caring relationships with those who attend through **ONE-ON-ONE MENTORSHIP** and seek to continue those relationships when they return home—

where they must learn to balance the noise of the world with their new found clarity in Christ.

### *life skills & recovery*

We hope to offer **FRESH START** at Chester County Correctional Center once it fully reopens to groups post COVID. It is an 8-week course that teaches residents to think differently and prepares them to make positive choices when they return to home. We also look forward to restarting **CR INSIDE**, which is Celebrate Recovery inside prisons, offering a safe place for residents to find freedom from their hurts, hang ups, and habits.

### *encouragement in writing*

Prison takes its residents back to a time before text messaging, where personal mail is **TREASURED**. Knowing this, Scripture-based **CARDS OF ENCOURAGEMENT** are an integral part of our ministry. We send them weekly those who attend any of our groups. We also send them to inmates incarcerated in other prisons when requested. For some, this is the only mail they receive.

### *grace in times of need*

Through the generosity of local churches, we offer **MEN'S & WOMEN'S GRACE BAGS** to our clients when they are released from prison or come to our office for assistance. These reusable bags include toiletry items, a devotional and a few clothing or luxury items to demonstrate God's

grace and provision while starting fresh.

### *angel tree*

At Christmas, we partner with local churches and the Chaplain's office to provide gifts to the children of women at the Chester County Prison through our version of **ANGEL TREE**. We encourage personal interaction between sponsors and our Angel Tree families, and make sure that each family receives a children's Bible, in addition to gifts.

### *mentor training*

68% of ex-offenders return to prison within just 3-4 years. The barriers they face are overwhelming. Having a mentor can be key to a successful reentry. Recognizing this, we've partnered with ReTURNing Hearts under the Chaplain's office to develop and offer **PRISON & REENTRY MENTOR TRAINING** to all religious volunteers at Chester County Prison (CCP) as a first step toward addressing this need, with more trainings to follow.

### *bridging the gap*

In coordination with the mental health coordinator, we offer **COMMUNITY RESOURCE WORKSHOPS** to men and women in Chester County Prison. These workshops educate residents to the resources available to them and their families in the County, empowering them to begin changing their lives for the better—while still incarcerated.
